So when did August become our rainy season? We have a pretty full lake considering it is August, and we have weathered several storms as well. Two of these storms caused many lake residents to be without electricity for 12-15 hours. An idea has been mentioned to Ameren engineering on a way to install a transfer switching station that would re-route the electricity when the normal feeder line has an outage. Don't look for this to happen anytime soon, but it's in the engineering stage. I know many of us have backup generators for when the power does go off. It is extremely important that safety is on your mind when you are hooking up your generator. #1 The gas engine puts off carbon monoxide, so it must be put in an area that will not allow exhaust to enter your living space. And #2, you cannot allow your generator to back-feed out onto the main power line. Please use a licensed electrician for your backup generator transfer switches. There are linemen working on these wires and the wires need to be unenergized from all known sources (your generator) so that the linemen are not electrocuted. Please be SAFE, and keep those working on the problem wires safe as well.

Our roads have been trimmed of the overhanging trees. This has created a very large pile of vegetation at the overflow parking area near the southside feeder creek. PLEASE, if you have your trees trimmed DO NOT add them to this pile. Please instruct your tree trimming company to take the debris with them. *continues in next column after Calendar*

Homeowners' Responsibilities

There have been times when some homeowners have had sewer backups in their houses or yards. There are several causes of backups, including foreign materials (like "flushable" wipes), circuit breakers tripping, pump failure, or tree roots in the line.

Our central sewer system is now twelve years old and each homeowner should be aware of homeowners' responsibilities to maintain their portion of the system. At each home, the homeowner is responsible for the gravity line exiting the house until it reaches the STEP tank. The sewer district responsibility begins at the STEP tank and continues to the treatment plant. *continues in next column*

Sewer District News continues from previous column

Here are the major guidelines that each homeowner should follow. Homeowner must:

- Make sure no foreign material goes down the drain. Foreign material includes flushable wipes, Kleenex, paper towels, feminine products, food scraps, oil, grease, and paint. These materials will clog the filter and cause backup or overflow.
- Make sure the system has electrical power, even when the house is unoccupied. If rainwater seeps into your system, it could overflow.
- Call the sewer operator 636-257-3976 (or emergency number 888-970-1382 after hours) if the control panel alarm sounds or the alarm light is on. The operator is the expert on the system and will determine the cause of the alarm.
- Make sure only authorized district representatives open the STEP tank risers – the district will not be responsible if someone is injured or becomes ill after opening a lid. The homeowner will be responsible if the district equipment is tampered with or damaged.

These guidelines are based on Article V of the Sewer Use Ordinance No. 01-2010 and amendments available online at

http://www.laketishomingo.com/pwsd13/forms.html. Article IX of the same ordinance makes it a misdemeanor to violate this ordinance and provides for fines and coverage of expenses to repair any damage.

• Alan Ricotta - M59–M63 – Plans to add a new culvert and to concrete an existing driveway. Also adding a patio.

Ken made a motion to approve the work to add a new culvert, to concrete the existing driveway, and addition of the patio. Doug seconded. Motion approved.

- Mark Haas I14-I17 Property is going up for sale. Asking for approval to add a dock when the new owner presents the application. Cannot approve a future dock request given the specifications for the new dock are unknown. The new owner should submit the dock request once they own the property and the approval process will be conducted at that time.
- Gary Reeves 6576 S. Lakeshore Dr. Paving a rock driveway with concrete. This request was electronically approved.
- Daniel Sloss G45 & G46 The resident previously submitted a request to set a pergola on their property that was constructed from a store-bought kit. There was no mention in this request to anchor the pergola to the ground. Therefore, the pergola was considered movable personal property and approved to be constructed.

In fact, review of the result shows the resident built a framed, roofed carport/pavilion that is anchored into concrete piers in the ground. This action contradicts the original request that stated the pergola would not be attached to the property.

Per Building Restrictions, once the pergola is anchored to the ground it is considered a permanent structure and therefore must be of stick-built construction. More research will be conducted to determine how these situations have been handled in the past. There is another similar structure on the lake that will be reviewed also.

<u>Security</u>

- Talked to resident regarding excessive use of gate code. Code is no longer being used.
- Incident on June 24th or 25th Rocks were thrown which generated damage (holes) in 10 or 12 mailboxes. Occurred around 10:30pm. Currently have not been able to determine who is responsible.

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- June 28th at 2:00am Cars trying to gain access to the lake, drove through Bob Roberts' and Joan Jaeger's yards to get inside the gate. Then the offenders opened the 'out' gate to let the other cars in. No damage to the gate. Minimal damage to the yards involved. Security used gate video to identify the drivers. The kids apologized profusely to Bob Roberts and went back to the property to clean up the mess. Jefferson County has been notified. Bob Roberts indicated he did not want to press charges.
- Ethan Schweiss launched jet skis on the lake. Incident occurred at night. Ethan's parents were not aware of his decision to ride the jet skis on the lake. The parents apologized for the incident. No further action will be taken provided future incidents do not occur.
- Memorial Day Weekend
 - The patrol boat was present on the lake for a significant amount of time over the weekend.
 - There were numerous violations of missing stickers on boats. Boat owners were notified that stickers are needed.
 - Stopped woman for running full throttle in the 'No Wake' zone plus no stickers on the boat. Woman exhibited belligerent behavior.
 - Sunday morning unknown owners were attempting to launch a boat with no stickers into the lake. Both the boat trailer and truck pulling the boat did not have plates. The owners were asked to leave the lake and they did.
- We have not had a patrol boat for a year now. We are hoping that incidents on the lake will lessen as we all get accustomed to the patrol presence again. The diligence of the patrol staff over the Memorial Day weekend will help set the tone for the upcoming fourth of July weekend.
- Can we initiate fines for missing boat stickers? We would need to check with Bianca to determine if fines are allowed within Tishomingo restrictions. A fine process was considered fifteen years ago and was not adopted. *continues on next page*

- It was noted that there seems to be a lot of pontoons traveling down the middle of the lake during skiing hours, seemingly headed towards the dam. Aaron stated that when stopped the driver usually indicates that they are waiting to cross over to the other side of the lake.
- Obeying the rules of the water does not have to be construed as a negative thing. Try to retain a positive attitude when encouraging all to obey the rules of the lake. We all want to enjoy Lake Tishomingo safely.
- Bouncy House at the Community House
 - LTIA try to discourage having a bouncy house
 - LTPOA and LTIA are not considered liable for any bouncy house incident given the bouncy house is not lake equipment.
- Installation of gate to Community House grass area
 - The gate was previously approved electronically.

Steve made a motion to have Happy Grass install the new gate for the Community House grass area at the typical rate (Mark will abstain from this vote)

Jon seconded.

Motion approved.

- \circ $\;$ Gates will be installed next week.
- Mark will get locks and give a set of keys to the LTIA. He will also move the rental trailers into the grassy area.

 - An area of fifteen acres by three feet of silt needs to be removed
 - Energy Resources is being considered as the company to use for the dredging

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- There are other factors that need decisions
 - Lake to Land would need to find and purchase or rent land to deposit the silt removal – the silt can be pumped up to a mile away – leaning towards pumping the silt to remove given the exorbitant cost of hauling out by truck
 - Lake to Lake there would need to be approval from the Army Corp. of Engineers and the Department of Natural Resources for this option to be used
- Possible future plan would be to create a peninsula somewhere within the beach area that would capture the silt before it enters the lake. Then the silt could be removed more easily and in a more timely fashion. The design of this capture area and the process would need to meet the requirements of the Clean Water Act. Only clean water would be allowed to go back into the lake therefore water inspections would be needed. More research is needed to determine if this option is feasible.
- Steve asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Ken made a motion to adjourn. Shelby seconded. Motion passed.
