The event schedule for 2009 is on page 2 of this newsletter so I will be very brief this month and just say that I hope you will attend and enjoy the planned events.



The meeting opened at 7:05 p.m. with the following board members present: Janet Hirsch, Ron Sansone, Kevin Seelbach, Ann Schatzman, Marilyn Meyer and Joe Hejnal.

President Sansone asked for a motion to accept the October minutes which are posted on the website. Motion made by Marilyn Meyer, seconded by Joe Hejnal. Motion passed.

President's Report

President Sansone began the meeting by thanking homeowners for their cooperation in paving their driveways. Only a couple of driveways are left that need to be paved and the board is in the process of working it out with the homeowners. President Sansone also thanked Joe Hejnal for his efforts in working with Meramec Paving.

Marilyn stated that there are 9 delinquent assessments, 2 of which the board is filing suit against. Two properties are in foreclosure and one has a contract on it.

Marilyn stated that it is the board's intention to keep a running log of the truck's maintenance and repairs.

Finance Committee

Janet Hirsch stated there was no new information to report.

Security

Joe Hejnal reported that the current security guard, Jeff Burgert, was hired on at the St. Genevieve Police Department and that we were going to have a new security guard named Larry. Joe thought Larry was going to be present at the meeting this evening, but he was not.

Communications Director Report

Janet Hirsch stated the newsletters have been mailed out and that the deadline for the next newsletter is December 20, 2008.

Building Director

Joe Hejnal reported he had two permits submitted for review.

1. Steve Blaha submitted a request to add on to his existing garage.

2. Ted Spaid submitted a landscaping request.

Motion made by Joe Hejnal to approve building requests, seconded by Kevin Seelbach. Motion passed.

Maintenance

Joe Hejnal reported that the truck was in bad shape. The truck was sandblasted by Liberty Sandblasting – the job was caught just in time. Joe stated that he and his son took the truck to Linecks so they could apply Lineck's coating to the truck. The board agreed a power washer was a necessary purchase in order to keep the truck cleaned and maintained.

Joe additionally stated that the snow plow was fully repaired and repainted bright yellow.

President Sansone stated that he would like to set a date to move the material from the old maintenance shed to the new shed. He would like to eventually run electric to the new building. Marilyn Meyer set the date for which volunteers can help with the move to Saturday, November 15, 2008 at 8:30 A.M. President Sansone also stated that they would burn any and all trash and make the decision to rent a dumpster after all of the trash is piled up.

Joe also reported that the patrol boat was stripped down completely to its frame in order to find the leak. Joe filled it with approximately 6 gallons of water and found out that the boat is leaking from the pressure outside in. He stated that it was a slow leak. Kevin Seelbach stated that he would like to purchase a 200 amp electric panel for the new building. All board members agreed this was a necessary purchase. The panel would cost approximately \$200.

Gate Committee

Russ Wilner reported only one problem with the outbound gate this past month. The program was rebooted and the gate was fine.

President Sansone stated that we were still looking for volunteers to help with the maintenance of the gate.

Web Site

Janet Hirsch stated that the current newsletter is posted on the website.

Dam Committee

Rich Hirsch stated that there was nothing to report on the dam.

Sewer Committee

Janet Hirsch reported that the Sewer Committee would be mailing out, at the end of the year, a beautiful informational brochure. The brochure will explain the project, our status, the operation, funding, plans and the need for electrical easements from homeowners to connect to the sewer pump. Janet also stated that the new sewer treatment plant would be built centered at the back of the dam. Money will be received for the construction when bids are accepted. Projected start date is January 2009. [*This start date has since been changed to some time in spring 2009. -- jmh*] November 19, 2008 is the next Sewer Committee meeting.

Old Business (Board)

President Sansone commented on the beautiful new bathrooms and paint job in the Community House which were done at a minimal cost with the help of volunteers in the community.

New Business (Board)

Rich Hirsch reported that a property near the front of the lake has a growing amount of yard waste which needs to be removed.

Stickers - Janet Hirsch stated that the board needed to formalize regulations and penalties regarding stickers. Janet read a list of rules aloud and made a motion that we make the rules a part of the standard regulations.

Mary Leiweke stated her concerns with regard to guests visiting the Lake Tishomingo community and if they were going to be penalized for being in the subdivision or if a Lake Tishomingo property owner needed to be with guests at all times when guests are within the subdivision limits. Mary also stated that she is a part of various other lake communities and they make guest passes available for purchase by property owners for \$1. Mary kindly agreed to research the use of guest passes and how to incorporate them into our lake community.

A motion was made by Janet Hirsch and seconded by Marilyn Meyer to pass the security rules. Motion passed. Homeowners will be notified of the above in the upcoming newsletter. The new security rules are on page 9.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Kevin Seelbach and seconded by Janet Hirsch to adjourn. Motion passed. The meeting concluded at 8:05 P.M.

Stickers

Security Rules

Approved November 2008

Vehicles and Boat Trailers

Use of the Community House parking lot is restricted to Lake Tishomingo lot owners. The exception is during special events or Community House rentals when invited guests are permitted to park there.

The owner of any vehicle or trailer in the parking lot that does not have a current Lake Tish sticker will be cited for trespassing.

Boats

The boat ramp is only for use by Lake Tishomingo lot owners. Any boat that is launched at the ramp must have a current sticker.

Every motorized boat operating on the lake must have a current Lake Tish sticker on the port side of the bow.

Every boat operated on the lake must have the owner's lot identification on both port and starboard sides of the bow. The lot identification must be in alphanumeric characters at least 3 inches high.

ATVs

Use of ATVs within Lake Tishomingo subdivision is restricted to Lake Tishomingo lot owners. ATVs are permitted only on paved roads and in the Community House parking lot. ATVs are not permitted on paths, parkways, or other common ground. Every ATV must obey the ATV rules.

The owner of any ATV on Lake Tish property that does not have a current Lake Tish sticker will be cited for trespassing.

Penalty

Citation recipients will be subject to a \$25 penalty fee.

Cost of Stickers

Until January 31, 2009 the stickers will be free for all property owners. February 1, 2009 the application fee (for any number of stickers) will be \$25.

New property owners will be allowed to obtain stickers for free for the first three months of property ownership.

Newly acquired boats and vehicles will be eligible for free stickers within the first thirty days of ownership by a lake property owner.

Don't get stuck without a sticker!

In order to make the acquisition of stickers easier for all property owners not yet in compliance with the requirement that all cars, boats, boat trailers, and ATVs, have a current sticker or face penalties, we will schedule the following two Saturdays in January for you to pick up your stickers.

JANUARY 10, 2009 10:00 A.M.--12:00 NOON JANUARY 24, 2009 10:00 A.M.--12:00 NOON AT THE OLD SALES OFFICE BY THE FLAGPOLE

You can go online at www.laketishomingo.com and find the required registration form under "Forms & Applications." Fill out the form and either submit it to the website or print a copy and bring it with you when you come to the sales office. No stickers will be issued without a completed registration form. We will have blank forms at the sales office on the Saturdays listed above, but be sure that you have all information regarding all items you are registering, including license plate numbers, where applicable.

If you do not have access to a computer, there are blank forms in a canvas bag on the outside of the sales office door. If you want to get your stickers by mail, send the completed form, along with a self-addressed stamped envelope, to one of the people listed below. LTPOA Meeting Minutes December 9, 2008

The meeting opened at 7:00 p.m. with the following board members present: Janet Hirsch, Ron Sansone, Ann Schatzman, Marilyn Meyer and Joe Hejnal.

President Sansone asked for a motion to accept the November minutes which are posted on the website. Marilyn Meyer presented a change to the new security rules with regard to stickers which were included in the November minutes. Marilyn made a motion to change the statement "New property owners will be allowed to obtain stickers for free for the first three months of property ownership" to "Newly acquired boats and vehicles will be eligible for free stickers within the first thirty days of ownership by a lake property owner". Motion seconded by Joe Hejnal. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Marilyn Meyer, Treasurer, reported for November. The Financial Report for November is listed separately. Motion to approve the Financial Report for November was made by Joe Hejnal and seconded by Janet Hirsch. Motion passed.

Marilyn presented the following bills for payment:

Motion to approve bills was made by Joe Hejnal and seconded by Janet Hirsch. Motion passed.

Marilyn stated that there are 4 delinquent assessments, and two of the properties are in foreclosure. Marilyn also reported that the personal property taxes in the amount of \$1,672 were paid.

President Sansone thanked Joe Hejnal for all his work on the truck – his work is greatly appreciated. The truck has been sandblasted and painted (with primer), has many new parts and a new rubber bed liner and blade.

Marilyn Meyer stated that the cost of salt has doubled in price to \$91.00/ton. The lake usually needs approximately 3 loads



per year. A truck load is being delivered tomorrow.

Janet Hirsch also expressed her thanks and gratitude to Joe Hejnal for all his work with the truck.

Maintenance

Joe Hejnal stated that the truck will be washed and drained and the bearings will also be greased after each use. Also, the truck may need new tires next year. Joe Hejnal additionally reported on the pontoon trailer. He replaced the bearing seals and buddy bearings and purchased a new wench which has not been put on yet.

LTIA Report

Mary Leiweke announced that the Chili Cook-off is to take place on Saturday, December 13, 2008 at 6:30 P.M. Additionally, Mary stated that LTIA gift cards were available for purchase for Shop N Save, Wal-Mart, Bass Pro, K-Mart and Old Navy to help fund LTIA projects.

Janet Hirsch announced that the 2009 Lake Tishomingo calendar is available for purchase. The calendars are filled with beautiful photos of the lake, the people, and the events. Full color calendars are \$20 each. Half color (monthly calendar grid pages b/w) calendars are \$15.

Security

Joe Hejnal reported that the new guard, Larry, would be present at next month's meeting. Joe stated that many people were concerned that the new guard was sitting in the guard station with the blinds closed. Today is a gray day at the end of December and it's raining. As I think back about 2008 I realize that indeed, water has played a major role this year.

January 6, the lake was down 107 inches due to the leak and the siphon. With the water so low last winter, we


scooped and hauled massive amounts of silt from the east end of the lake removing 60 years of accumulation. The next day we had 2.6"* of rain and that's how the year began.

In March we had a special election for the special assessment to pay for the repair of the leak in the dam. That assessment passed by a huge margin: 1727 to 698.

June 12 the repair of the leak was complete. The

output from the leak pipe dropped from 300 gallons per minute to a trickle.

Since the repair in June the lake level has remain high

Gate Committee

Russ Wilner stated there was nothing to report on the gate.

Old Business (Board)

President Sansone stated that an agreement needs to be worked out between the board and Mr. Marler. Instead of paying a yearly assessment, Mr. Marler would like to continue accepting silt being dumped on his property. His yearly assessment is \$350.00 and it is \$50/mi to haul away the silt. Mr. Marler will be responsible for paying his assessments when the board no longer needs to dump silt on his property.

Joe Hejnal made a motion to establish an agreement between the board and Mr. Marler. Motion seconded by Janet Hirsch. Motion passed.

Janet Hirsch stated that the Sutterer/Silhavy agreement was approved with regard to the property they are purchasing beyond the lake. The homeowners paid \$500.00 to the board since legal counsel was required.

This agreement serves as a precedent for any use of a lake lot to access land beyond the lake subdivision boundaries (LABOL). The essential elements of the agreement are:

• The LABOL is to be used only for single family residential home sites.

• A home site on the LABOL must be at least 40,000 square ft.

• Each home site owner on LABOL must also own a lake lot adjacent to the home site for the purpose of access.

• The only access to the LABOL home site will be through the

adjacent lake lot.

• The home site cannot be further subdivided.

• By owning a lake lot the home site owner will be entitled to full use of the lake and the lake roads.

• By owning a lake lot the home site owner will be responsible for payment of all regular and special assessments on that lot.

• The home site owner will abide by all the rules and regulations of the Lake Tishomingo Subdivision.

• Construction of a residence will conform to Lake Tish building regs, including purchase of a road bond if that is a part of the existing building regs.

New Business (Board)

Russ Wilner asked about the check dam at the southside bridge. He stated that the rock bed is falling apart and needs to be redone – need larger boulders? President Sansone responded that we will be rebuilding the check dam.

Rick Hannick stated that February 1, 2009 is the deadline date to obtain stickers before a \$25.00 application fee is instituted. He also reported that 167 people have acquired stickers. The forms you need to obtain stickers are located at the sales office.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Janet Hirsch and seconded by Marilyn Meyer to adjourn. Motion passed. The meeting concluded at 7:43 P.M.



Lake Tishomingo Community Sewer Project

Design of the Main and Lateral Lines

The Lake Tish central sewer project continues to move for-

ward. The Public Water Supply District #13 (PWDS#13) board is working very hard to keep the expenses down and is asking all homeowners to assist.

For a summary of the project funding and design see the previous issue of Tishomingo News, Nov/Dec 2008.

In late November surveyors visited every residence at Lake Tish and distributed marker flags for use by the homeowner. Please use these flags to mark the location of your septic tank, pipe from the house to the tank, and the left and right property boundaries. If you have a gray water line, please mark that also.

Additional flags are available at the little Sales Office. The more we can do to help the engineers, the more we can cut down on the time and expense involved in surveying for the placement of lateral sewer lines.

Please do your share to help keep down the cost of the sewer project. Use

the flags and encourage your friends and neighbors to use the flags to mark the property and septic lines. Everyone will benefit from homeowner participation.

The engineers expect to have the collection plan design completed in March.

If you have any special circumstance regarding the location of the septic tank,

summarize the information and contact one of the PWDS#13 board members listed above.

If you plan to build a new home or to remodel an existing home contact a district board member with the location, description, and timing of your planned construction.

Real Property and Rights Transfer

The LTPOA transferred the land behind the dam where the

wastewater treatment plant will be built. It's a rectangular area of 2.37 Acres directly behind the middle section of the dam.

The LTPOA granted easement rights to PWSD#13 for

the use of all LTPOA-owned property as needed to construct and maintain the central sewer system. The LTPOA assigned to PWSD#13 the rights under

article 13 of the Lake Tishomingo Restrictions to lay sewer pipes and appurtenances through or across a lot and at all times the right of ingress and egress for the purpose of repairing and maintaining same.

Ordinances

In the next few months the PWSD#13 board will be developing rules and regulations to govern the use of the central sewer system. These will be in the form of district ordinances that have the strength of law under Missouri Revised Statutes Chapter 247.

One ordinance will require mandatory hookup of residences within a set distance (probably 300 feet) from the sewer main lines. This is required by the USDA as a condition for receiving the \$2 mil-

lion loan money.

Other ordinances will deal with the proper use of the sewer system. They will require reasonable use of plumbing and no foreign material or chemicals poured into the sewer lines.

April Election



On Apr 7, 2009 an election for 2 directors for PWSD#13 will be held. To run you must be a registered voter of the District, have resided in the District one (1) whole year immediately prior to the election, must be at least 25 years of age, and shall not be delinquent in payment of taxes. Additionally, the candidate must reside within the Sub-District which the candidate seeks to represent. Sub-district 1: blocks I,

K, L; Sub-district 2: blocks A, B, C.

Board members are elected for three-year terms. Candidates should file at the County Clerk's Office, Jeff. County Courthouse, Room 217, 729 Maple St, Hillsboro, 8am - 5pm M–F, through Jan 20. D
