Annual LTPOA Meeting / June 20, 2020 President's Report Steve Blaha

Thanks to all who took time out of this Father's Day weekend to attend the annual meeting. There are three board members up for re-election: Shelby, Doug, Mark.

Thanks to all of the residents and lot owners of this fine community for sharing a common goal of making Lake Tishomingo a better place to live and have fun. In order to do that more fully

we need to respect what our predecessors have provided for us: The Bylaws, Owner Restrictions, Building Regulations, Fishing & Water Rules, ATV Rules, Security Sticker Rules, and Security Gate Rules.

New Security Company. This summer we have employed a new security company, A & S Protection. Aaron Staten and his staff are here to help us respect these rules and regulations more fully. Please be respectful of these officers; they are just trying to keep Lake Tishomingo a private community. It seems to be that the most commonly broken rules are the Water Activities Rules and Regulations. Please, pontooners, no wake at all times. No wake for all boats from 7:00 p.m. until 10:00 a.m. Please make sure your lot number and red Tishomingo sticker are on your boats, as well as your trailers, ATVs, golf carts, kayaks, and paddle boards. Remember, from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., slower traffic—paddle boats, paddle boards, pontoons, canoes, row boats—should stay closest to shore; this keeps the ski and tube lanes open for faster traffic.

Fireworks. I predict a record crowd of boats gathering at dusk on July 4th to stake their claims near point M-12. The Ewen and Jung families will entertain us with a spectacular fireworks display. So let's do our part by making sure that our running lights work for a safe return to our homes.

LTPOA News continues from previous column **Roads.** We will begin identifying the weak spots in our seven miles of road next week, to ensure that we stay ahead of any major repairs.

Lake Lowering. We will begin lowering the lake October 1st. Our goal is to take it to 4 feet below normal pool. This is a great time to take advantage of the low water condition for dock install and repair as well as sea walls. So please get an early start with your contractor and get your blueprints to the LTPOA board for approval.

Silt Problem. With the low water condition, please take a look at our silt problem. It is not going away; in fact, it is growing. This will be our next large-scale project. I hope we can make it another four years. We will be removing silt from the south side inlet creek, on the upstream side of the culvert pipes.

Water Willow. We will be spraying the water willow in the near future. [See the Tishomingo Anglers report on page 3 for details.]

Volunteers. It has been my pleasure to serve with the six people who make up the LTPOA Board.

Shelby Reneski, Jon Riche, Doug Leeker, Ken Stojeba, Mike Steeno, and Mark Stubits. During our involvement we have worked together to resolve issues and make the necessary decisions to keep our lake community the solvent entity that it is. I know those decisions may not always be popular, but they have been made with the Lake's best interest in mind. These talented, selfless, community-minded VOLUNTEERS deserve a round of applause!

Sewer Report

PWSD#13 Job Opening

Paid position. The sewer district needs someone to answer phone calls and visit with customers who have a problem during evening or weekend hours. Requires good communication skills. To apply, contact PWSD#13 Board member Cheryl Miller, <u>cmille42@gmail.com</u>.

Meter Reader Report

The pump hours meter reader completed the canvass of the district and the sewer board reviewed all the pump operation data. Pump rates are calculated on an annual basis as hours per year and the distribution of values found is shown in the graph below. Each vertical line represents one household. The height of the line represents the pump rate.



The "Pump ON" float switch in the STEP tank turns on the pump for about 30 minutes and sends about 250 gallons of wastewater to the treatment plant. If a pump comes on once a day, the household is using 250 gallons of water per day and the annual pump rate would be 182.5 hours/year. The pump rates measured this year range from a high of 473 down to zero. Over the next few weeks, the systems with unusually high numbers will be inspected by the operator to make sure they are functioning properly.

Protect Your System

Reminder: flush toilet paper only! <u>Flushing other paper products</u> will damage the sewer system and can lead to sewage backup in your house or yard.

Help the Sewer Board keep our system in good repair. If you notice a broken sewer lid, please report it by emailing <u>PWSD13@charter.net</u>, noting the address of the nearest residence.

In Case of Alarm

If your STEP tank control panel sounds an alarm (like a smoke alarm), call the operator at (636) 257-3976. The audible alarm can be silenced by pushing the lighted button located directly above the "Push to Silence" label on the front of the system's electrical control panel. With normal use, the tank has a reserve storage capacity good for 24–48 hours.

Use Insect Repellent

Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellents with one of the active ingredients below. When used as directed, EPA-registered insect repellents are proven safe and effective, even for pregnant and breastfeeding women. *ACTIVE INGREDIENTS*

- \checkmark DEET
- ✓ Picaridin (known as KBR 3023 and icaridin outside the US)
- ✓ IR3535
- ✓ Oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE)
- ✓ Para-menthane-diol (PMD)
- ✓ 2-undecanone

Find the insect repellent that's right for you by using <u>EPA's</u> search tool.

Tips for everyone

- \checkmark Always follow the product label instructions.
- ✓ Reapply insect repellent as directed.
- \checkmark Do not spray repellent on the skin under clothing.
- ✓ If you are also using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and insect repellent second.

Tips for babies and children

Dress your child in clothing that covers arms and legs. Cover strollers and baby carriers with mosquito netting. When using insect repellent on your child:

- ✓ Always follow label instructions.
- ✓ Do not use products containing oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE) or para-menthane-diol (PMD) on children under 3 years old.
- ✓ Do not apply insect repellent to a child's hands, eyes, mouth, cuts, or irritated skin.
- ✓ Adults: Spray insect repellent onto your hands and then apply to a child's face.

Cooking Corner

LIMONCELLO ARNOLD PALMER

4 tea bags 14 ¹/₂ cups water, divided ¹/₄ cup sugar 12 oz can frozen lemonade ¹/₄ cup lemon juice (Need not be fresh. ReaLemon is fine.) (1 liter) bottle of club soda Limoncello to taste Fresh lemon for garnish (optional)

1 - Brew the tea. Heat 4 cups of the water to boiling. Add the 4 teabags. Cover and remove from heat. Steep for 5 minutes. Remove teabags. Add ¹/₄ cup sugar and stir until dissolved. (The sugar is to sweeten the lemon juice in step 2. It dissolves easier in the warm tea.) Add 8 ¹/₂ cups water. Let cool.

3 - Chill.

4 – Just before serving, add club soda and stir gently.

Serve in short highball glasses over ice. Add 1 shot of limoncello (or to taste) to each serving. Garnish with lemon slice, if desired.

This makes about 22 ounces.
