LTPOA Meeting Minutes July 9, 2013

Board Members Present: President Gordon Kassen, Marilyn Meyer, John Johnston, Steve Blaha and Ray Lauer.

Excused Absence: Kevin Seelbach – There is one vacancy on the board

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 o'clock p.m. by President Kassen. Those present, 12 residents, all recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. The president then expressed his appreciation for those who attended the annual meeting, and he asked for a moment of silence for the 19 firefighters who had perished in the Arizona wildfire last month.

Minutes of June 2013 meeting

A motion was made by Marilyn, seconded by John, to waive the reading of the minutes which had already been published in the Newsletter. MOTION PASSED

Treasurer's Report

Marilyn reported income of \$82.44, representing payment for gate cards, trailer rental and interest from the checking account.

Payments totaled \$38,135.93 and included such items as \$34,780.00 to CEG Paving for road repairs, \$1,152.00 to Red Oak for grass cutting on the dam and another \$540.00 for additional grass cutting. The remaining items include rental for the portable toilet, \$200.00 for the annual audit, oil and fuel stabilizer and gasoline, picnic tables and sand for the volleyball courts.

Marilyn added there are delinquent assessments as the result of two vacant houses. Gordon interjected there is an effort being made to get foreclosure on the one house.

The checking account balance is \$178,146.62.

Marilyn then sought approval for expenditure of \$4,757.63 for other bills that needed to be paid, including \$1,531 to Sentry Security for guard service, \$306.89 for publication of the Newsletter and resident listings, \$960.00 for grass cutting along the north and south lakeshore roads, among other issues. John made a motion to approve all payments, and this was seconded by Gordon. MOTION PASSED

Marilyn also reported thus far she received assessment payments from 55 property owners.

Gate

Russ Wilner was not available to provide a report, however there was a discussion regarding cameras at the gate.

Security

Ray reported that on Sunday July, 7 he had been contacted by the guard who reported having discovered a door unlocked at the Community House, and he was able to secure that door. Also, the guard reported that at the conclusion of the fireworks on July 4 there was a line of cars exiting the subdivision and it required about an hour for the group to clear. The issue was having each vehicle stop and wait for the gate to lift before the next vehicle could proceed. He suggested that in the future the exit gate should be in a raised position until the vehicles all exit.

Steve mentioned having been on the patrol boat on July 4 when he observed a pontoon boat outfitted with a 70 hp engine. The boat bore identification of Lot A-14, Roxanna Scanlin. The operator was informed the engine size was illegal and told to remove the boat.

Building

John presented plans from Thomas Kelly, Lots A27 and A28, who asks for permission to replace an existing deck and add a screened porch. After reviewing the architectural drawings, a motion was made by Gordon, and seconded by Steve to approve the project. MOTION PASSED

Maintenance

Gordon reported the dump truck is currently disabled and he has been in contact with someone from ELCO Chevrolet about a

replacement. The high cost for a newer truck is of concern, so this matter was tabled until a later date.

LTIA

Janet Hirsch reported she had been given information by Charles and Shelby Reneski, O-2, they have scheduled a party on their property on August 17, 2013 and there will be an 8-piece band. While this is a private event, boaters are welcome to anchor and hear the entertainers. The music will be played between 6 and 10 p.m.

Also, the Boat Poker date is August 10.

Finance

After a discussion, it was agreed the budget committee and board members would convene a budget planning session at 10 a.m. on Saturday, August 3, so a budget can be developed for the coming fiscal year.

Web site

Janet advised the deadline for submission of material for the next issue of the Newsletter is August 20, 2013.

Garden Club

Appreciation was expressed to Chyree DeRoode and Jackie Marschuetz for having planted trees at the mini park.

Sewer Board: No report

Water Testing and Dam Report

Marilyn read a report that had been provided by Clarue Holland regarding water testing. Also, the Department of Natural Resources inspection of the dam will occur in July 2014.

Old Business

There was a discussion about the number of trash containers that should be available outside the Community House. At the conclusion, when it was felt there should be two additional containers, John made a motion to contract with Bec Tel Trash Collectors for two 96-gallon wheeled carts. Marilyn seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED

New Business

Steve, after learning of the gate issues on July 4, suggested that for 2014, when the 4th of July celebrations will be part of a three-day weekend, that the outgate remain in the raised position at the end of the day as guests are leaving the subdivision. Also, he suggested the ingate should be in "free mode" during all three days of the weekend to accommodate guests coming into the lake.

Steve also mentioned the issue of boaters and others who disregard our rules and regulations. John Dauernheim suggested taking the names of offenders and publishing them in the Newsletter.

Steve suggested there should be an effort to get the culverts and roadside ditches cleaned of leaves to facilitate the flow of water after rains. This will be further pursued and a date selected for an effort to get this task accomplished with volunteers. For property owners who do not attend to these matters on their property, perhaps there should be a discussion about assessing a fee to defray the cost of work, if a contractor needs to be employed.

Janet Hirsch suggested there should be signage installed in the area at the south end of the lake where the inlet is, to prevent boaters from entering that area and possibly damaging a boat motor. This is necessary because of the boulders that were installed last year. Janet volunteered to get a sign prepared and when available will be installed so it is visible to boaters.

Several property owners present at the meeting then made comments about matters they felt deserved attention.

There being no further business, Ray made a motion the meeting should be adjourned. Marilyn seconded this motion. MOTION PASSED. The meeting was adjourned at 8:07 p.m.

LTPOA Meeting Minutes Aug 13, 2013

Board Members Present: President Gordon Kassen, Marilyn Meyer, John Johnston, Steve Blaha and Kevin Seelbach

Excused Absence: Ray Lauer

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. There were 29 property owners present in the audience and all recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

At this point President Kassen introduced the guest speaker, Sheriff Glenn Boyer. The sheriff was accompanied by Sheriff's Lieutenant Pat Hawkins who is in charge of the Zone that includes Lake Tishomingo.

Sheriff Boyer explained that his office is understaffed and that requires him to prioritize calls for response. Serious situations get immediate attention. Deputies will respond to every call but not necessarily right away. He asked each person in attendance to express any concerns they may have.

Those voicing their opinions, or asking questions, spoke about illegal boats and fishing, gate breakage, trespassing, home intrusion, etc. Sheriff Boyer indicated his department has a boat for water patrol and it can be scheduled for use, provided it is available and if two weeks advance request is sent to his office. If the boat were utilized here, deputies would not enforce Lake Water rules. Primarily deputies operating the boat are watching for intoxicated operators.

Sheriff Boyer also provided an explanation about statutory vs. civil matters, as it relates to deputies responding to requests for service.

The sheriff can be reached at his office by dialing 636.797.5521. Lieutenant Hawkins' phone is 636.797.6214. The Zone office on Highway 30 is staffed from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily and can be reached by calling 636.797.6216.

At the end of the presentations, the meeting was called to order at 8:00 o'clock p.m.

President Kassen mentioned a recent accident involving past Board member Phil Overy, and his hospitalization, and asked those present if they would consider offering a silent prayer for his recovery.

Security

Gordon then introduced Kurt Will, lake resident and president of Will Electronics, who explained where additional cameras could be located should there be agreement by the Board to purchase this equipment.

President Kassen then provided an overview of where possible new lighting could be installed. The cost is expected to be \$40.00 per month for electric service, \$1,500 for installation of a new pole by Ameren and \$249.78 for 158 feet of cable installation. There were no solid proposals and no motion was made.

Minutes – July 2013 meeting

A motion was made by Marilyn Meyer, seconded by John Johnston, to waive the reading of the minutes that had been posted on the web site. MOTION PASSED

Treasurer's Report

Marilyn presented the cash inflow report. Kevin Seelbach made a motion to accept and approve the report. This was seconded by John Johnston. MOTION PASSED

Marilyn then presented bills for payment, totaling \$10,809.65. John Johnston made the motion to approve payment, and this was seconded by Kevin Seelbach. MOTION PASSED

The entire financial information will be reflected in the Newsletter. [The financial reports are shown on page 11.]

Finance Committee

Janet Hirsch reported the Finance Committee met on August 3, 2013 and developed a proposed budget for 2013-2014. The eight largest entries represent 75% of our expenses.

The total expense budget is \$163,770 and that provides a reserve of \$173,976. Janet recommended approval of the budget. A motion was made for approval by Marilyn Meyer. This was seconded by Kevin Seelbach. MOTION PASSED. [The approved expense budget is shown on page 11.]

Gate

Russ Wilner asked the Board to consider guidelines for him when property owners request special, short-term entry (party) gate codes. There was no resolution during this meeting.

Building: No report

Newsletter/website

Janet reported the deadline for the next newsletter is Aug 20, 2013.

Sewer Project

Janet reported work is underway (work began July 22) for updating the alarm float switches in the 238 sewer tanks and should be completed by August 16. Work was performed by Dale and Chris and was supervised by the Plant Operator, Dave Axton.

In addition to upgrading the floats, urethane foam was applied to the conduit connected to the electrical junction box in the tank. This was done to seal out moisture from the boxes and prevent false high level alarms. This work was done by the original sewer contractor, TGB.

Water Testing

Clarue Holland presented results of testing conducted on August 5. Nine sites had no detectable levels of coliform. Six sites had detectable >10 colonies/100 ml, but not approaching the limit of 200 colonies/100 ml.

Dam

Clarue requested approval to spend \$65/gal for herbicide. This is for woody bushes and stems not possible to cut with the lawn mower. This was approved without a motion. Gordon suggested the grass cutter be employed to apply the herbicide.

New Business

John Dauernheim reported he had been contacted by a member of the Leiendecker estate with a request that the LTPOA repair the railroad tie wall on that property. Board members denied this request.

Ken Droege (junior) asked about tearing down the Eime house and rebuilding a house. He was informed the requirement for building remains at having 40,000 square feet to build a new structure.

A resident then claimed a home was built next to his property that did not meet that requirement.

Gordon then reported he had received four bids for cleaning ditches, 3 areas on the north side and 2 on south side roads, and the lowest bid was \$5,000, received from Rigs LLC. After discussion, Gordon made the motion to accept this bid. It was seconded by John Johnston. MOTION PASSED

The meeting was adjourned.

Float Update Project Complete

The contractor's one-year warranty period ended July 27 and workers finished sealing the conduits and replacing the float switches. This should greatly help eliminate the false alarms that caused buzzing at some control panels.

Direct Deposit

Homeowners are encouraged to consider automatic payment of the sewer bill. The invoice postcards are issued the first of every month and payment is due on the tenth of that month. Payments not received by the 21st of the month are delinquent and subject to lien and prosecution.

Proper Use of the System

To keep your system operating properly be careful about what you allow to go down the drain.

Do not use the garbage disposal excessively. Food by-products accelerate the need for septage pumping and increase maintenance. Collect grease in a container and dispose with your trash. Compost table scraps or dispose with your trash.

Do use your trash can to dispose of substances that can clog filters, cause maintenance problems, and increase the need for septage pumping.

Do not put any of the following items into the system:

- Egg shells, cantaloupe seeds, gum, coffee grounds
- Tea bags, chewing tobacco, cigarette butts
- Condoms, dental floss, sanitary napkins, tampons, diapers
- Paper towels, newspapers, candy wrappers
- Rags, large amounts of hair
- "Flushable" wipes, baby wipes, medicated wipes, cleaning wipes
